Baze, rode 12,842 thoroughbred winners in a career that began in 1974 and had a record 53,578 mounts. He also rode Appaloosa, Arabian and quarter horse winners. Born in Vancouver, British Columbia, Baze began his career in the Pacific Northwest but moved to Northern California in 1980 and won the first of his 54 jockey titles at Golden Gate Fields in 1981. He also won 40 titles at Bay Meadows and numerous others on the summer-fair circuit.

In 1994, he was named the National Football League Executive of the Year by The Sporting News and Pro Football Weekly, as voted on by NFL owners and executives.
